All Art students should have the following items, unless otherwise noted, by the Monday after the first day of school:

Sketchbook – spiral bound or hard cover - 8 ½" x 11" or 9" x 12"

Supply box or pencil case (approximately 5"x 8"x 2")

Drawing pencil set – 12 pencil set ranging from at least 4H to 6B

Eraser

Notebook or three ring binder with pockets

Additional Art Supplies requirements by course:

Art as a Hobby in addition to the supplies listed above, fabric and wood for kite making – exact information given closer to actual project date in the spring, canvas tennis shoes for painting (may be old, clean shoes) – second semester, clean white tee shirt for tie-dying – second semester, two yards of inexpensive fabric for rag-rug making – date when needed will be given later in second semester, additional items for certain projects and notification will be given ahead of time.

Drawing: Items listed above. Students may choose to bring additional drawing media of choice, Portfolio to store daily work (approximately 23" x 31" x 2")

Ceramics: Items listed above, a set of pottery tools (optional)

Art I/Survey: Items listed above. Two poster boards (22"x 28") in any color. Students may choose to bring their own markers or other drawing media.

Art II: Items listed above. Two paint brushes (½ " flat and ¼ or ½ " round) for acrylic paint, (additional assorted brushes optional), two 22" x 28" poster boards any color, a small plastic palette (preferably with a cover).

Art III: Hard cover bound sketchbook, set of brushes for acrylics and a set for watercolors (sizes will be discussed in class), a kneaded eraser, a plastic palette (preferably with a cover), an art supply box large enough to hold supplies, portfolio to store daily work (approximately 23"x 31"x 2"). Students may choose to bring in other drawing/painting media.

Honors and AP 2D Studio: Hard cover bound sketchbook, good quality oil/acrylic brush set (sizes to be determined), 1" x 2" boards and cotton duck canvas (size to be determined), oil paint set with extra white (the school will have a basic starter set), small container of turpenoid, a palette (varieties available will be discussed in class), drawing pens with a variety of tips (optional), an art supply box large enough to hold supplies, portfolio to store daily work (approximately 23"x 31"x 2"). Additional items may need to be purchased depending on the student's choice of projects.

Portfolio: Hard cover bound sketchbook, an art supply box large enough to hold supplies, portfolio to store daily work (approximately 23"x 31"x 2"). Additional materials and supplies will depend on the direction of the work chosen by the student.

Please contact your teacher if there is any difficulty or hardship in getting these supplies. Most all supplies can be purchased at Art Coop, Hobby Lobby or Michaels, though many can be found at discount stores. Also, check on-line for coupons for Hobby Lobby and Michaels.
